Event Objective

This event aims to bring together the expertise and ability of language usage by the students in various topics.

Event Summary

- The NDLI club in association with Literary club, Intellectual Property Rights Cell and Research cell of Jansons Institute of Technology together organized the ‘English Essay competition’ on the event of English Language Day on Saturday, April 23, 2022. The topics of the essay competition are given the day before to all the first-year students. The topics of Essay writing competition are ‘Is language a carrier or barrier for communication?’ and ‘Your favorite author and his style of writing’. The Flyer was shared to all the students of various departments beforehand. The students were given instructions on how to write by relating the topic. The tips and tricks for writing a good essay has been taught.
- Students were given 45 minutes to write the essay with around 500 words. A classroom was allotted for the participants to sit and write. The essays have been evaluated later. The competition was posted in the official website of NDLI Club, through which students generated their E-Certificates. E-Certificates will be issued to all the registered participants. The students were able to write with clarity and they found the nuances of writing essays. Students had given their complete cooperation for the competition. They felt it as an escape from the routine and enjoyed themselves by expressing their opinion. Students claimed that they need such literary events once in a month.

Civil Disobedience and the Dandi Salt March:
 The women started their march on the road to liberty by breaking salt law, forest law, taking out "Prathak Pheries?" Sarojini Naidu was specially nominated by Gandhiji to initiate said upto Charsara Salt Works in May 1930. During the movement, Kamla Devi addressed meetings, prepared salt and pickled foreign cloth and liquor shop.

Conclusion:
 Women shouldered critical responsibilities in India's struggle for freedom. They held public meetings, organized picketing of shops selling foreign apparel and articles, sold khadi, and actively participated in National Movement. They bravely faced the lathi charge, the police and went to jail hundreds and thousands of Indian women dedicated their lives for obtaining freedom of their motherland.

Kasturba Gandhi, the wife of Mahatma Gandhi, and the women of the Nehru family, Kamla Nehru, Vijaya Lakshmi Pandit and Sushila Kaul, Shyama and Janak led the movement in Lahore.

Savitribai Phule:
 Savitribai Phule worked selflessly to empower women in India, repeatedly urging them to educate themselves, particularly those who come from the so-called backward castes. She said education will be the weapon that will free women from social discrimination. She is known as India's first female teacher.

Mahadevi Varma:
 Born to a progressive Hindu family in Allahabad in 1867, Mahadevi Varma evolved into a Hindu poet, freedom fighter and educationist. She adopted English literature and French and set up a school in Allahabad, and worked tirelessly for the cause of the education of women. She was the principal of the first girls' school in Allahabad.
